A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR DR. PATRICIA CORCORAN

Welcome to Western Earth Sciences! As the Department Chair, I am excited to provide you with one of three newsletters that will be sent to you throughout the year. Expect them in February, June and October. The new name for our newsletter is "To Earth and Beyond"; whether we're "digging" for critical information below the surface, collecting crucial samples from the surface or atmosphere, or studying other planets remotely, we're all part of the extraordinary field of geoscience.

I've been at Western for 15 years and I've served as Department Chair for 12 months already – it's tough to believe! Quite a number of new faces have arrived in our department offices. Kristen Harris is our new Administrative Officer, Amy Wickham is our new Academic Program Coordinator, and Alysha McNeil is our new Geoscience Collections Curator. Two new faculty members have joined our team: Nigel Blamey (Economic Geology) and Katsu Goda (Earthquake Hazards and Risks). Steve Hicock (Quaternary Geology) has retired, but will continue to contribute to our department from an emeritus space just around the corner from his old office. Two of these individuals (Gail Atkinson and Gordon Osinski) are highlighted in the newsletter for having won prestigious awards.

Huge congratulations go out to our graduate students who have completed their degrees in the past year, as well as to our undergraduate students who will be graduating this week. I'm particularly proud to announce that for the first time in many years, an Earth Sciences student will be awarded the J.B. Bancroft Science Prize and Medal (awarded to a graduating student in the Faculty of Science with the highest standing in an Honors Science Program who has achieved an "A" average in second, third and fourth years). The winner this year is Aamna Sirohey, who is working with Sheri Molnar this summer using passive seismic techniques to understand how local geology impacts the amplification of seismic waves. She will begin working full-time with Sander Geophysics in September.

I'd like to end the message from the Chair by stating that all seven of our field courses offered in the 2017-2018 academic year were a great success! The courses included: Field Geography and Geology of Southwestern Ontario (ES2130), Introductory Field Mapping Techniques (ES2250 – Whitefish Falls, Ontario), Advanced Field Mapping Techniques (ES3350 – Sudbury, Ontario), Planetary Surfaces Field School (ES4001/PS9605 – Arizona), Regional Field Geology (ES4450/GL9601 – Nova Scotia), Geophysical Field Techniques (ES4451/GP9509 – Calabogie, Ontario), and International Geoscience Field Experience (ES4452/GL9600 – Colombia). 


ALUMNI FEATURE: ALYSHA MCNEIL, PHD

After completing my B.Sc. at the University of Waterloo in 2011, I started my M.Sc. in experimental petrology at Western with Dr. Robert Linnen. In 2014 I was upgraded to the Ph.D. program and Dr. Roberta Flemming was added as a co-supervisor as crystal structure became a component of my research project. Over the course of my Ph.D., I had the opportunity to work as the electron microprobe operator for the Earth and Planetary Materials Analysis Laboratory on the JXA-8530F Field Emission microprobe and during the Fall 2017 term, taught ES 1081A - Earth, Environment and Sustainability. In March 2018 I successfully defended my Ph.D. on the crystallization processes and solubility of niobium and tantalum minerals in pegmatites.

After completing my thesis, I took a short trip to Hawaii with my husband to celebrate, and as of May 3rd, 2018, started in my new position for the coming year as the Geoscience Collections Curator at Western University for the new collections facility. The Earth Sciences department and I are currently working on the creation of a facility to house and display specimens from the Suffel, Dana, and other collections within the department. Currently, these collections are stored in a closed tunnel on campus with limited access. The new collections facility is to be housed in the North Campus Building and will contain a large display area and multiple storage rooms for the safe and proper storage of the thousands of rock and mineral specimens within these collections. The timeline for the opening of the facility is still being developed but will likely be in late 2018 - early 2019. Stay tuned for updates regarding progress!
