Pictured in the Joint Biomechanics Laboratory, Jim Dickey's research focuses on low-back injuries associated with whole-body vehicular vibration and other issues related to joint mechanics.

Whole-body vehicular vibration is a significant health risk for between 4 and 7% of the work force in North America. Current work is focused on specific vehicles within the mining, forestry, steel-making and construction industries with future research broadening in scope.

The Joint Biomechanics Laboratory is supported with research grants from Workplace Safety and Insurance Board (WSIB) and NSERC. Equipment in the lab is supported by CFI.

Dickey's team includes PhD student Andrew Dragunas, MSc students Ryan Frayne, Rob Caryn, Katherine Plewa, and Undergraduate students Michelle Gu and Derrick Nield.

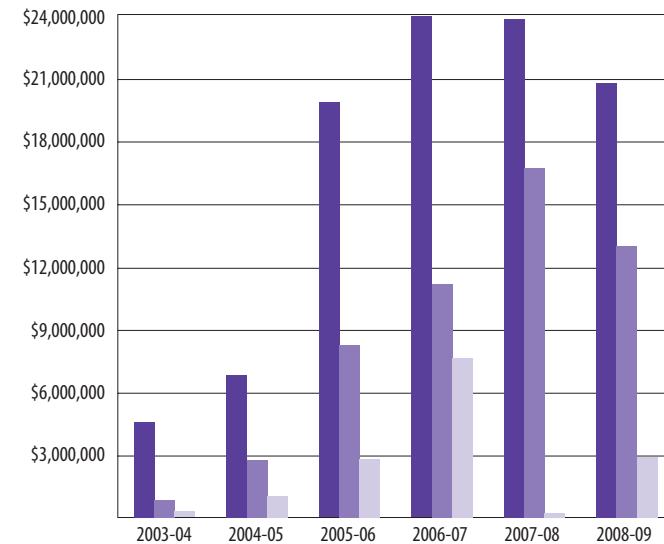
