Course Description:	An introduction to linear programming, simplex method, duality theory and sensitivity analysis, formulating linear programming models, nonlinear optimization, unconstrained and constrained optimization, quadratic programming. Applications in financial modelling (investment portfolio selection).

- Simplex Method in Matrix Form, Revised Simplex Method (1 week)

- Nonlinear Programming and Multi-variable Optimization, Nonlinear Equations (3 weeks)
- Constrained Nonlinear Optimization, Lagrangian, Penalty and Barrier Methods (2 week)
- Optimization Using Quadratic Forms, Quadratic Programming (1.5 weeks)
- Discrete Optimization, Branch and Bound Methods (1 week)
- Applications: Portfolio Optimization, Optimization Toolbox (1 week).

Most examples have versions for Matlab, R, or C++. Students can use software by their choice for the assignments.

The final exam will cover the entire course but with greater emphasis on the topics taught after the midterm.

Remember: You understand the material if you can answer questions about it that you have not seen before. For this, it is important to understand the concepts. Remembering all the formulas is not enough. In particular, it is expected that you learn and remember the definitions and the statements of the theorems, and that you can provide examples of each concepts presented in class.
