#### **Course Description**

After a review of basic concepts in statistical inference, various types of experimental designs will be described with a view to determining the appropriate techniques for analyzing data collected in various fields of scientific investigation and drawing appropriate conclusions. As well, several sample survey techniques will be discussed.

This course aims at introducing the theory and practice of the design of experiments and the analysis of surveys.

#### **Methods of Evaluation**

The overall course grade will be calculated as follows:

Three assignments (every three weeks or so), each worth 7.5%

*Two in-class tests,* each worth 30%, the first one to take place on Wednesday October 4<sup>th</sup> and the second one on Wednesday November 15. In the event that one legitimately misses a test and provides the required supporting documentation, the other test will be worth 50%, each assignment, 10%, and the final project, 20%.

A non-programmable calculator will be required for the tests.

A final project worth 17.5%
