Is boredom an emotional state or does it hint at something more substantial than the ephemerality of experience? Is it a product of alienation, or a very concrete experience of how things actually are when we aren't deluding ourselves about the world around us?

Graduate students at all levels are invited to submit abstracts for presentations of twenty minutes. We invite papers from a variety of disciplines and approaches, addressing the fundamental and theoretical questions about social constructions from the perspectives of visual culture, art history, and art practice.

Graduate student candidates from various fields, including but not limited to, visual arts, history, museum studies, cultural studies, gender studies, and theory are invited to submit abstracts or artists panel proposals. This multidisciplinarity allows and encourages perspectives that address or intersect with visual culture, art history and art practice..
