Michael Klein, gallerist and Toronto-based artist will give a talk in the *Art and Popular Culture* class. *All welcome. Admission Free.*

Toronto based artist, Michael Klein participated in the early activities of The Winnipeg Photographers Group as well as Video Pool in Winnipeg, and has been exhibiting video and photo-based work for more than 25 years. In addition to several exhibitions at Winnipeg's Plug In ICA (Inc.), in 2002/03 he conceived and co-curated Plug In ICA's 30th anniversary exhibition, *Back In The Day 2002-1972*. Recent exhibitions include *Molly to Molly* at the *QueenSpecific window gallery on Queen St.W. in Toronto, *Citizen Dandy* at the Art Gallery of Windsor and *i and i* at the Confederation Centre for the Arts Gallery in Charlottetown. Citizen Dandy was also included in the exhibition, *Here Now or Nowhere* in Grand Prairie, Alberta in 2009. Video Pool in Winnipeg will be exhibiting *i and i* in 2010. He has curated, organized and programmed numerous

exhibitions and publications as a former member of the Public Access collective, projects coordinator at Art Metropole, and programming chair at YYZ Artists' Outlet. In 2007, he opened the MKG127 gallery in Toronto.

Vancouver based artist Gareth Moore is known for his playful and conceptually rigorous works produced from his investigations of the world around him.
