## Department Funding

- Funding packages are set up in Mercury (a software program through SGPS)
- You will receive an email with a link when your funding package is ready to view and confirm (subject to change depending on external funding)
- The stipend for graduate students as of September 1, 2021 is \$26,648/year. This money comes from GF(graduate fellowship paid by the supervisor) and GTA (graduate teaching assistant paid by the department). The stipend is divided equally over the 3 terms and then divided by 4 to be paid out monthly at the end of each month. Occasionally the department will pay the GF portion for the supervisor which results in a lump sum payment of that portion and is applied directly to your tuition account. In the terms that you are not scheduled to TA, the supervisor will pay the full GF or it may be paid by a combination of GF/department funds (know as WGRS). We will make every effort to inform you ahead of time if there will be a lump sum payment. I advise students never to assume they will receive this payment in a lump sum (it's dependent on department funds) and be prepared each term to pay your tuition as usual. In the event you have already paid your tuition and receive the lump sum GF payment, your account will be credited and your money returned to your bank account on file with Human Resources via EFT.
