ACADEMIC POSITION - EMERGENCY MEDICINE PROGRAM

Clinician Researcher and Director of Research

The Department of Medicine, Emergency Medicine, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at Western University, St. Joseph's Health Care London, and London Health Sciences Centre is seeking a physician for a full-time continuing clinical academic appointment to Western University. Applicants should be certified, or eligible for certification, by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or the College of Family Physicians of Canada with Added Competence in Emergency Medicine, or equivalent. Candidates must have an MD, or equivalent, and must be eligible for licensure in the province of Ontario. The successful candidate should currently hold a clinical academic appointment at the rank of Associate or Full Professor.

The successful candidate will be expected to oversee the research budget and to participate in the academic commitment of the Division and Department.

The Director of Research will provide leadership, and encourage and promote all types of research by members of the Division of Emergency Medicine (DEM). They will work closely with the FRCPC and CCFP(EM) Residency Program Directors to ensure residents meet the research requirement of their programs. The Director of Research will encourage faculty involvement in research and provide a supportive environment in which to conduct clinical research in the LHSC Emergency Departments and St. Joseph's Health Care Urgent Care Centre. They will collaborate across









disciplines and with investigators at other universities to grow the DEM Research Program. They will have experience in grant application and submission and will have a proven track record of grant success.

Applicants must have extensive experience in Emergency Medicine research.

Compensation for this position will be commensurate with qualifications and experience and will be composed of fee for service income, alternative payment plan income and academic productivity-based compensation.
