Successful applicants will be integrated into the teaching, research, and clinical care activities of the appropriate clinical department at The School. The Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry partners with a wide range of hospitals and hospital alliances in Southwestern Ontario.

Academic and/or Clinical Expectations: The successful candidates will hold a full-time Limited Term Clinical Academic appointment at the rank of Lecturer, Assistant Professor or Associate Professor, or a Continuing Clinical Academic appointment at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor, depending upon experience and qualifications at the time of appointment.

Qualifications or Experience and Skills Required: Candidates must hold an MD degree or equivalent and be eligible for licensure in the Province of Ontario. The successful candidate will have a commitment to and demonstrated aptitude for teaching and will be expected to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels and to supervise graduate trainees. The successful candidate will also have a demonstrated record of research and publication.

Compensation Details: Contractual arrangements commensurate with experience and qualifications and will be composed from the following sources: fee-for-service (OHIP billings), Alternative Funding Plan (AFP), academic support/salary (if applicable), and other sources (e.g., hospital on-call coverage, if applicable).
