





Clinical Academic Appointment: Clinician Teacher, Department of Family Medicine Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry Western University Fowler Kennedy Sport Medicine Clinic

The Department of Family Medicine at the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, Western University, is inviting applications for **three full-time clinical academic teaching positions** within an innovative and exciting Department of Family Medicine.

Candidates must hold an MD, or equivalent, with certification from the College of Family Physicians of Canada, including a Certificate of Added Competence (or equivalent) in Sport and Exercise Medicine, and be eligible for licensure in the Province of Ontario. A relevant master's degree or interest in pursuing a Master in Clinical Science (Family Medicine) or medical education is preferred. Clinical practice experience is preferred with experience and interest in teaching being essential. The successful candidate will be a Clinician Teacher and hold a full-time Limited Term Clinical Academic appointment at the rank of Lecturer or Assistant Professor, or a Continuing Clinical Academic appointment at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor, depending upon qualifications and experience at the time of appointment.

Compensation will be based on qualifications and experience and will be composed primarily of the following sources: clinical income from the Ontario Health Insurance Plan, academic alternate funding, and/or other academic support.

The successful candidate will be expected to start on April 1, 2024, or as negotiated.
