ACADEMIC POSITION: Interventional Radiologist (IR)

The Department of [Medical Imaging](#), Division of Diagnostic Radiology, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, at Western University, London Health Sciences Centre and St. Joseph's Health Care is seeking a Vascular and Interventional Radiologist for a full-time clinical academic appointment to Western University. Rank (Assistant, Associate or Full Professor) and appointment status (limited term or continuing) will be determined by experience and qualifications at the time of appointment.

The Department of Medical Imaging at Western University an integrated city-wide sub-specialty practice across the three Hospital sites: University Hospital (UH) and Victoria Hospital (VH), collectively known as the London Health Sciences Centre (LHSC), and St. Joseph's Health Care London (St. Joseph's). The Department provides multiple regional services to a population of >2M.

There are opportunities for an enthusiastic radiologist to contribute to the building of an integrated, multi-disciplinary and collegial Academic Medical Imaging Department in the Vascular Intervention Division.

Position Profile: The successful candidate will be expected to take an active role in the Interventional Radiology Division and must be dedicated to outstanding quality in clinical operations, demonstrated leadership, teaching and/or research. The candidate will be expected to provide academic and clinical services at St. Joseph's and the London Health Sciences Centre hospitals. The ideal candidate will possess a scholarly profile towards teaching and research/innovation.

Candidates will be expected to provide a full range of diagnostic and procedural clinical services required of an Interventional Radiologist. St Joseph's is an ambulatory care center, with lower acuity patients. The SJH IR caseload includes vascular procedures including venous peripheral and central lines; a small number of arterial procedures (with potential for growth); adrenal vein sampling; urology procedures for a major endourology patient population; and MSK interventions. The LHSC caseload includes a wide range of acute care and oncology patients, including vascular and nonvascular (but no MSK) interventions. The ability to perform CT/US guided non-vascular procedures such as biopsy and abscess drainage is required.

Essential skills required for general radiology practice in the community include breast imaging, fluoroscopy, ultrasound guided injections and superficial biopsies, and diagnostic skills in general ultrasound and computed tomography. MRI skills are considered a bonus.

Qualifications: The successful candidate will hold certification in Diagnostic Radiology with the Royal College of Physician and Surgeons of Canada or international equivalent and will need to meet the current credentialing requirements of LHSC and St. Joseph's. Candidates must have an MD, or equivalent, and must be eligible for licensure in the province of Ontario. Subspecialty Fellowship training in Interventional Radiology is required. Additional sub-specialty expertise in another area will be a distinct advantage. The successful candidate will be a self-starter, team player and be willing to participate in all aspects of academic imaging and intervention including on-call duties as required by the Chair/Department Head of the Department.

Compensation Details: Estimated total remuneration from all sources, including fee for service and alternative funding plan, will be in the range of \$350,000 - \$500,000 annually and commensurate with qualifications and experience.

The City: London, Ontario. London is Canada's 11th largest city with a population over 400,000, a catchment area of over 2 million, and is situated in southwestern Ontario between Toronto and Detroit. The region has a diverse economy and excellent educational opportunities. It is a safe and diverse city and its numerous parks, trails, recreational, cultural and sporting opportunities make it an attractive place to live.

The University: Western University is a research-intensive university with full-time enrolment of about 34,000 students with a full range of academic and professional programs. The Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry provides an outstanding educational experience within a research-intensive environment where tomorrow's physicians, dentists and health researchers learn to be socially responsible leaders in the advancement of human health.

Western, like many postsecondary institutions in Canada, is moving beyond sole reliance upon Indigenous self-identification in its hiring processes. St. Joseph's Healthcare, London: St. Joseph's Hospital is primarily an ambulatory care center and provides patient care that complements the acute care hospitals of LHSC. Current clinical imaging equipment has been recently upgraded to state-of-the-art technology, including two 1.5T MRI, one 320 slice CT, modern ultrasound, and new state of the art mammography equipment including digital tomography and contrast dual energy mammography. Research imaging equipment includes a 256 slice CT, and a 3T PET/MR. A PET/CT serves clinical and research functions.

London Health Sciences Centre (LHSC): One of Canada's largest acute-care teaching hospitals, LHSC is dedicated to excellence in patient care, teaching and research. For more than 138 years, LHSC has provided patient care for the people of London, the region, and beyond. Many national and international medical breakthroughs have been pioneered at LHSC, to the benefit of patients locally and around the world including the routine use of robotic surgical techniques for coronary artery bypass surgeries, routine and novel approaches for transcatheter aortic valve implantations, minimally invasive mitral valve reconstructions and complex reconstruction techniques of the entire thoracic aorta – all of which are heavily reliant on preoperative and postoperative multimodality imaging consultations. LHSC is also home to a strong established surgical program, the regional trauma center, and the London Regional Cancer Program (LRCP), a world class cancer care facility that provides comprehensive care to oncology patients from across Southwestern Ontario.

Research: The Department of Medical Imaging supports and encourages opportunities to engage in imaging related research with the Robarts Research Institute (www.robarts.ca) and Lawson Health Research Institute (www.lawsonresearch.ca), in association with Western University and Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry.
