



## Clinical Dentistry – Assistant Professor (2 positions) Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry University of Western Ontario London, CANADA

The University of Western Ontario (Western University) is an internationally renowned researchintensive university that is ranked among the top-ten in Canada, and prides itself in the "student experience" of its educational programs. Included in these programs are medical (MD) and dental (DDS) students within the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry (the School), which accounts for the only other dental school in Ontario that is outside of Toronto. The Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry has a long tradition of excellence, beginning with the founding of the medical school in 1881 and continuing with the formation of the dental school in 1964. It is one of Canada's preeminent medical and dental schools and is known for being the birthplace of family medicine in Canada. For more than 130 years, the School has demonstrated a commitment to academic excellence and a passion for scientific discovery. Accordingly, the dental school draws on a highly qualified and talented pool of applicants that train in very rigorous and demanding professional programs. The didactic content is enriched by the medical sciences, and the clinical experience supported by local general and specialist practitioners, and a large patient pool from across Southwestern Ontario.

Applications are invited from qualified individuals for two positions in Restorative Dentistry to begin on April 1, 2021, although an alternate start date may be arranged. The successful candidates will be appointed in a Limited-Term appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor for a period of 1 to 5 years, depending upon the qualifications, experience, and performance. Candidates must possess a DDS/DMD degree (or equivalent) and have at least 5 years of experience in clinical practice. Preference will be given to candidates with a broad clinical skill set and experience in prosthodontics, implant restoration, endodontics, periodontology and oral surgery. In addition to clinical teaching it is expected that the candidate will participate in clinical curriculum design, leading of small group case based learning seminars, monitoring of student clinical progression and participation in faculty calibration and development. Candidates must hold or be eligible to hold a General Certificate of Registration with the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario (RCDSO).

Successful candidates should possess a demonstrated aptitude for leadership as well as teaching and clinical mentoring of junior colleagues, students or residents in either community dental practice or institutional programs. Candidates must have excellent oral and written communication skills in the English language and must be willing to work in a collaborative manner in both teaching and administration. Compensation will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. The opportunity for private practice is afforded by the provision of a consulting privilege of one day/week.

With a full-time enrolment of 32,000, Western University graduates students in a full range of academic and professional programs. The University campus is in London, a city of 404,000, located midway between Toronto and Detroit. With parks, tree-lined streets and bicycle trails, London is known as the "Forest City".
