

## **Reduced Workload Limited-Term Appointment in Biology**

The University of Western Ontario invites applications for a half-time Limited-Term faculty appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor, to participate in the delivery and administration of first-year Biology lectures and laboratories, at Western University. The start date is anticipated to be September 1, 2020. The initial appointment will be up to two years in duration and may be renewable. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. The successful candidate will be appointed as a faculty member in the Department of Biology, Faculty of Science.

This position is a half-time (50% of a full-time faculty appointment) position (20 hr/wk), and has been created in support of teaching and administering Western's large First Year Biology Program (~2000 students). Duties are divided between Teaching (60%) and Service (40%) activities. Teaching duties will include 1.0 full course equivalents of first year biology undergraduate courses, including development of online curriculum, over a twelve-month period. Service duties encompass all aspects of the administrative coordination of the First Year Biology lectures and laboratories, including management of academic accommodations, processing of exams, marks administration, etc.

• A PhD in Biology or related field with experience teaching first year biology at the university level
