Sample questions for the Mind Comprehensive Exam

- 1. Explain some varieties of Behaviorism in philosophy and psychology. Do any of them remain plausible?
- 2. Are intentional states multiply realizable? What implications does your answer have for the plausibility of the Identity Theory about mental states?
- 3. "One mental state being represented by another is both necessary and sufficient for the lower-order state to be a conscious one". Explain and evaluate this claim.
- 4. Explain at least one causal-historical account of mental content. Explain its (dis)advantages. Is this even the right sort of approach for explaining the metaphysical underpinnings of content?
- 5. What is physicalism? Does the conceivability of zombies undermine physicalism? Can we genuinely conceive of zombies?
- 6. What role might "narrow content" play in philosophy of mind. Is there really any such thing as "narrow content"?
- 7. Explain Eliminative Materialism. Are there elements of the Eliminative Materialism movement that are worth embracing today?
- 8. Describe several bizarre-sounding thought experiments in philosophy of mind. Is appeal to such things a very reliable methodology?
