Instructions and Report Template

As part of the protocols outlined in Western's Institutional Quality Assurance Process (IQAP), to facilitate the continuous improvement of academic programs between review cycles, in connection with the Final Assessment Report (FAR) and Implementation Plan, a monitoring process will include an Ongoing Improvement Progress Report. The following report template has been created for the program to report on progress made regarding recommendations presented in the Implementation Plan, and any other relevant program developments and enhancements.

- The program will complete the template and submit it to the faculty Dean's Office for sign-off.
- The program will then submit the completed Ongoing Improvement and Progress Report to the Office of Academic Quality and Enhancement (OAQE). Reports are due by June 30.
 - The OAQE will present all Ongoing Improvement and Progress Reports to SUPR-U/G for approval. Approvals, or any follow-up questions/concerns, will be communicated to the program and Dean's Office by the OAQE.
 - It should be noted that as per the requirements of the province's Quality Council, progress reports will be posted on the <u>reports page</u> of the OAQE website.

A streamlined and reformed PhD program has been in operation since September 2021.					
We have revised our milestones and clarified procedures following IQAP and SGPS recommendations and guidelines (2020-21). During the 1st year of the PhD program, students have to submit a "Prospectus" that presents their thesis project; during the 2 nd year, they have to write the "Examen de synthèse" or "Projet de recherche", submit the "Bibliographie annotée" and "Projet de thèse". The 3 rd and 4 th years of the program are now entirely dedicated to research and writing the dissertation. These revisions were approved by SUPR-G and Senate in Summer 2021. Following these changes, new policies were established that better reflect and support the program's objectives. Internal administrative procedures such as forms and instructions were also revised to maintain clarity and efficiency in managing the program and ensuring excellent follow-up with students. Supervisory committees are suggested to students upon entrance to the program to assure good progress.					

We have upgraded and improved our website to reflect these changes and maintain transparent communication with students.

The content of the seminar has been revised to include practical tips and knowledge that reflect the current challenges of graduate studies and the job market.
