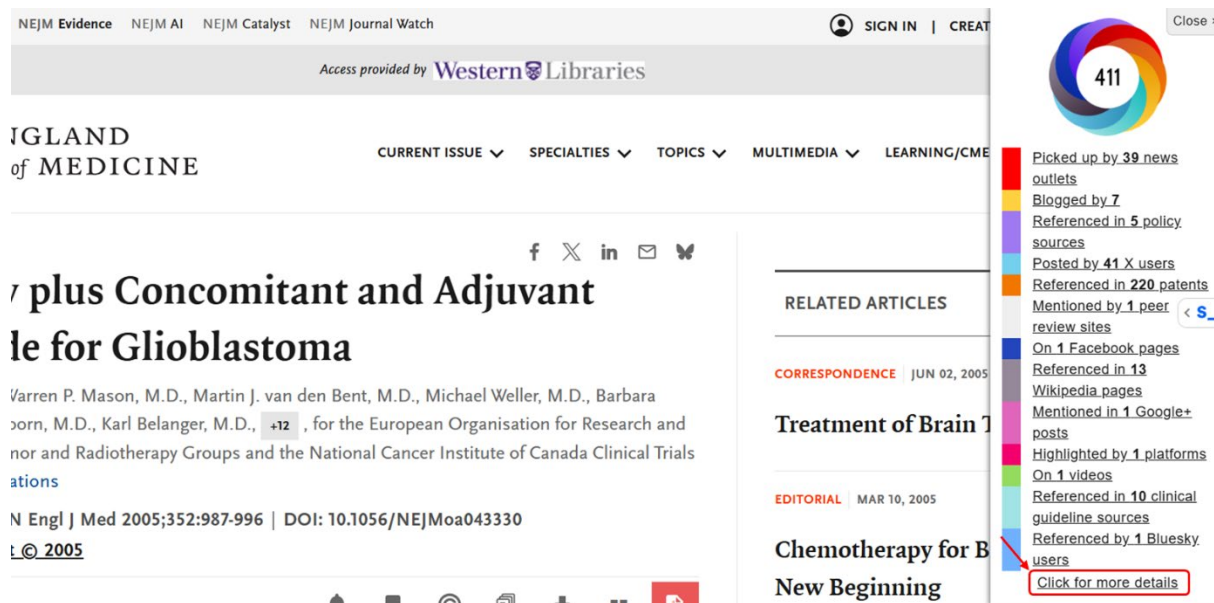


Metrics available in Altmetric Bookmarklet

After installing the Altmetric Bookmarklet to your web browser, search for the publication of interest in Google Scholar, and by clicking on the “Altmetric it!” button on the bookmarks bar, attention gathered by the publication will be available on the publisher’s webpage (if applicable), including mentions in:

- social media (e.g., X/Twitter, Facebook, Bluesky, Reddit),
- news outlets,
- policy documents,
- patents,
- Wikipedia posts,
- clinical guidelines,
- blogs,
- peer-review platforms,
- videos,
- Q&A (e.g., stack overflow),
- Etc.

By clicking on the “Click for more details” or the corresponding hyperlink for the type of mentions of interest, you can see more detailed information of the mentions.
