To create a slide that attracts viewers as well as conveys information effectively, it is essential to create text and graphics that clearly and easily communicate your research in a short period of time

Slide contents

A typical research presentation may include the following sections. However, you are encouraged to use your creativity and imagination to design your slides.

- Introduction
- Literature Review
- Objective: reasons why you are doing this work
- Results, including Equations/Plots/tables
- Conclusion
- Discussions and future research
- References

General suggestions

- Complete text, such as format sentences and paragraphs, requires proximity and a significant amount of time to read. So, it is better to keep the information as concise as possible.
- . Use bullets, diagrams, charts, and tables as much as possible to deliver your message quickly and effectively.
- Keep text to a minimum. The text should be sufficient to clearly explain your work but there should not be excess text.
- Use large figures with clear labels.
- Use more figures and less text
- Address different audiences in your poster, such as the general public, someone in your area of research, and someone who is working in the exact same field.
