

## Director - Centre for the Study of Theory & Criticism

Nominations and applications are invited for the position of Director of the Centre for the Study of Theory and Criticism at Western University. One of the oldest and most established programs of its kind in North America, The Centre houses a graduate program offering Master's and Doctoral degrees in Theory and Criticism, including such areas of inquiry as Post-Structuralist Theory, Deconstruction, Social and Political Thought, Continental Philosophy, Psychoanalysis, Visual Culture, Media Studies, Gender Studies, and Queer Theory, Marxist Theory, Post-Humanist Theory, 18th & 19th Century Philosophy, and the History of Thought. The Centre's work addresses questions raised by these movements, hosting a dialogue among theory, its histories, disciplines and developments. We seek a director committed to the Centre's mission and to the ever evolving project of theory and criticism.

Nominees and applicants must be core faculty members of the Centre and have an appointment as a Tenured or Continuing Status full-time faculty Member in one of the participating Faculties (Arts and Humanities, Social Sciences, Information and Media Studies, Music and Education). The Director appointment will be effective July 1, 2026 for a three-year term, renewable. The Director leads the teaching and research mission of the Centre, with responsibility for organizing courses, speakers, conferences, and public engagement.
