NIKOLOUDAKI, Georgia	Assistant Professor
<p>I am an Assistant Professor (tenure-track), and I am seeking election to Senate as the Dentistry representative because much of my academic work involves translating the realities of a clinical professional program into the broader university context where academic decisions are made. My responsibilities span teaching, clinical supervision, research, and service, and I am closely connected to the day-to-day functioning of our School. I work directly with students in didactic, preclinical, and clinical settings, supervise trainees at different stages, and lead an active research program that connects academic priorities with competitive funding environments and national expectations. I have also been involved in governance and regulatory work at both the school and national levels, shaping how I approach curriculum, assessment, and professional accountability. Dentistry operates within constraints that are often poorly understood outside professional programs, including clinical capacity, patient care obligations, accreditation standards, and regulatory requirements. I work within these constraints as part of my regular academic and clinical responsibilities and am accustomed to explaining their implications clearly in institutional discussions. As a Senator, I will bring an engaged, current, and grounded Dentistry perspective to the table while contributing constructively to the broader academic mission of Western.</p>
