## Course Description:

A studio/theory seminar required for students in the third year of the Honors Specialization in Studio Arts. As a forum for engagement with methods and practices of professional artists it will help students prepare for the portfolio review required for entry into SA 4605 Practicum.

Antirequisite(s): the former VAS 3382A/B.

**Prerequisite(s):** <u>Studio Art 2602A/B/Y</u> or the former VAS 2282A/B, and registration in the Honors Specialization in Studio Arts module, or permission of the Department.

Extra Information: 4 seminar/studio hours.

## Course Requirements:

- Students are expected to contribute in class in a thoughtful, timely, informed, focused, sensitive, and respectful manner.

#### Attendance:
